TIPS For A Successful Time Change:

The annual time changes can wreak havoc on families and classrooms every year. Here are a few tips to help your child with the adjustment.

*Think ahead and start adjusting your child's bedtime and wake up times leading up to the time changes. In the Fall start moving bedtime later using 15 minute increments. In the Spring start moving bedtime earlier using the same time frames. Don't expect your child to adjust quickly.

*The changes in sunlight can affect sleep patterns as well. In the fall try to avoid having your child fall asleep too early. Try to get some light in the evenings and make sure it is not too bright in your child's room in the AM.

*It is best to stick with your bedtime routines during these transitions. Children may be tired and feel unsettled. Be patient and remember this is only temporary.

As we are into the colder days, please ensure that your child has appropriate gear to go outside.
